Changes...

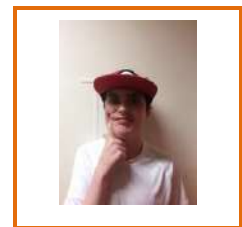
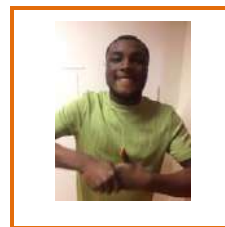
